COACH'S CORNER

As students experience CRCT testing, we must remember that this standardized test is just one sample of grading and reporting student academic performance. As parents, we must encourage our children to continue working hard, get their homework done and complete their schoolwork on time until the last day of school. In middle school, students must pass every class with at least a 70. First semester yearlong academic class grades are combined with those from second semester to get the yearly average which also must be 70 or above to be considered passing. Students still have time to bring up any failing grades. Summer school letters went out last week as a reminder for those students who need to take the last six weeks of school very serious. Eighth graders will have final exams, and some will take End of Course Tests. Team teachers are still having their regularly scheduled morning and afternoon help sessions. Encourage your child to be life-long learners and not just ‘lovers’ of learning while school is in session. Knowledge is Power!
